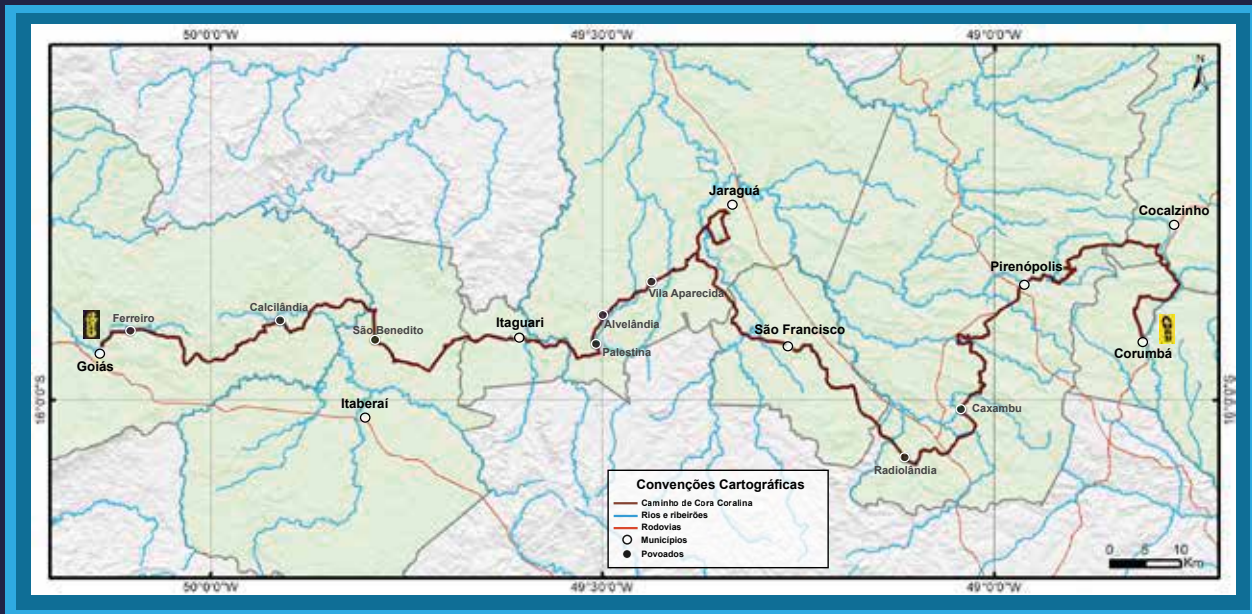

THE PATH OF CORA CORALINA



The Path of Cora Coralina is a long-distance hiking and cycling route in the state of Goiás, spanning approximately 300 kilometers. It traverses the historic cities of Corumbá de Goiás, Pirenópolis, São Francisco de Goiás, Jaraguá, and the Cidade de Goiás, also encompassing the municipalities of Cocalzinho de Goiás, Itaguari, and Itaberaí. The trail further passes through eight villages: Caxambu, Radiolândia, Vila Aparecida, Alvelândia, Palestina, São Benedito, Calcilândia, and Ferreiro.

Blessed with a hydrological network of over 60 watercourses, the 'Caminho' was conceived based on historical documents left by travelers who traversed Goiás since the 18th century. It crosses the state parks of Pireneus and Serra de Jaraguá, as well as the Carioca Municipal Park.

The Caminho de Cora Coralina Association was established with the objective of fostering social development and economic growth within communities that provide services along the trail. The association aims to raise environmental, social, and cultural awareness among these communities and among users of the Caminho de Cora Coralina. With over 50 members, the association boasts a wide network of providers offering accommodations, meals, transportation, and other services to hikers and cyclists.
